ABOUT US

A group of volunteers initiated a movement in 1968 to eradicate blindness, which led to the formation of Pakistan Eye Bank Society (PEBS) in 1976. Since then, PEBS has expanded its services nationwide, establishing Eye Banks in Rawalpindi (1978), Peshawar (1980), Quetta (1982), and later at Lahore, to promote nationwide cornea donations. Through these efforts, 36,000 corneas were pledged, and with support from Sri Lanka, over 16,000 corneal transplants were performed across Pakistan, primarily in Karachi.

To provide comprehensive eye care, PEBS began constructing its hospital in 1985, which became operational in 1993. The hospital offers complete ophthalmic services, including cataract surgeries, many of which are provided free of cost. Along with continuing the corneal transplant and eye donation campaigns, PEBS expanded its services by adding Dental and Maxillofacial facility. In 2023, a fully free Oral Cancer Surgery Unit was launched, followed by the establishment of a Breast Cancer Surgery Unit in 2024.

PEBS also provides Cardiac, Diabetic, and Free Dialysis services for underprivileged patients. Its Community Outreach Program extends healthcare to schools and remote areas through School Eye Clinics, Teachers Training Programs, awareness sessions, and medical camps.

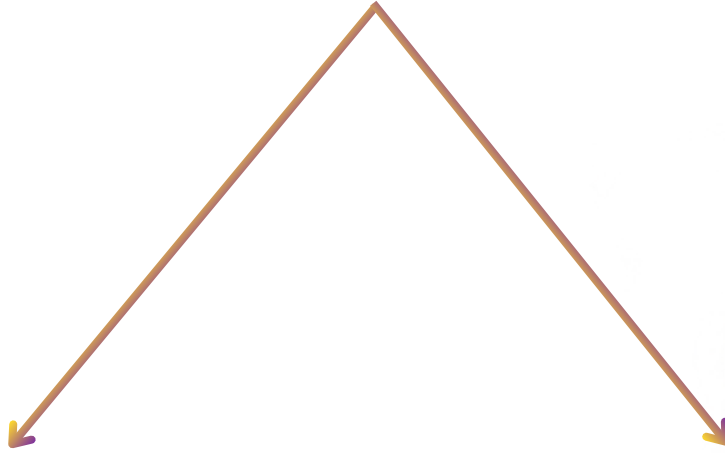

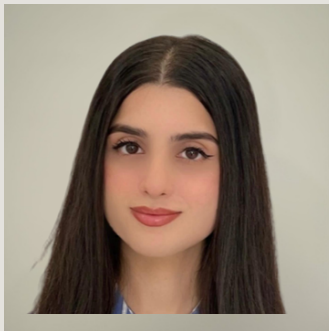

FROM THE PRESIDENT'S DESK



I am delighted to present our Annual Report for the period 2024-25.

The year under review has been full of activities in all operational units. Our diversified teams took the challenges with a firm commitment to resolve them and carved a healthcare niche for patients in need medical care.

Health sector is undergoing tremendous pressure with rising inflation since decades. The low income groups and those living below poverty lines do not have sufficient means to take care of their health issues. If we add the ratio of under-employment and unemployment then we note the severe financial burden on individuals and families specially children and elderly. PEBS Hospital is, therefore, on the forefront to cater to the needy patients. At a later stage we will research oriented clinical paper to School Eye Clinic Project.

Free Medical Camps under "Gift of Life" project continues to provide relief to people living in remote areas of Sindh. Completing two years, this important project has now become our flagship activity. Thousands of patients suffering from eye diseases and other health disorders have been provided with free surgeries, medicines and utilities with the possibility of always returning to PEBS Hospital for free treatment any time. Cornea Donation campaign which is our main highlight, got a huge enhancement when, according to her Will, we received the Cornea of our strong supporter, Ms. Zubaida Mustafa. She was a beacon of light during her lifetime and after death as well. Her cornea was successfully transplanted to a teacher who now teaches students and illuminates their future.

Oral Cancer Surgery Unit is now on frontlines due to its quality of medical expertise. Our good work has been noted by the government as well and soon we will partner with them on a number of areas to fight oral cancer. We are also working to reduce the impact of Breast Cancer, which is the number one killer in females. This Unit commenced functioning in 2025 and has successful surgeries and diagnostics to its credit. In the near future, we anticipate to add more facilities to serve patients.

I am humbled to say, that in any difficult situation, there has always been a silver lining. Philanthropy came out as winner to solve even the most difficult problems. Our valued Patrons reposed with full confidence on us enabling us to continue medical services at PEBS Hospital. I take this opportunity to pen my deepest appreciation for valued Donors and Patrons who are always standing at our side to help the needy in this trying time. 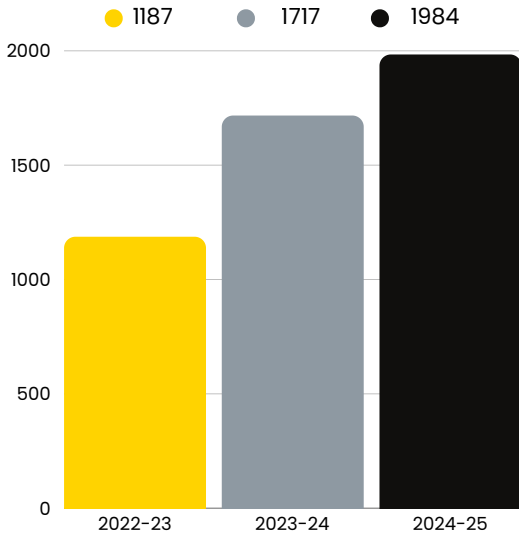
In 2024–25, the unit treated 45,556 patients, marking a notable increase from the previous year.

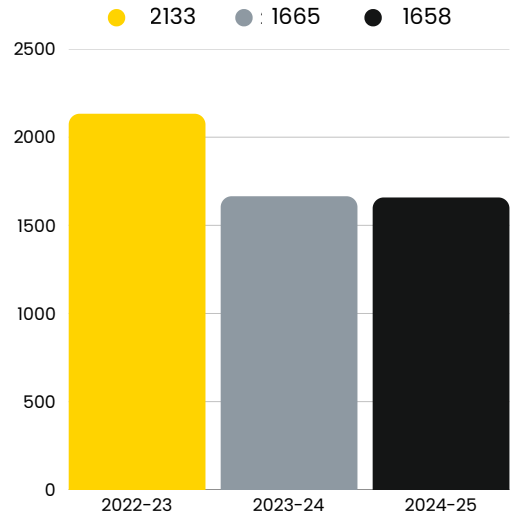

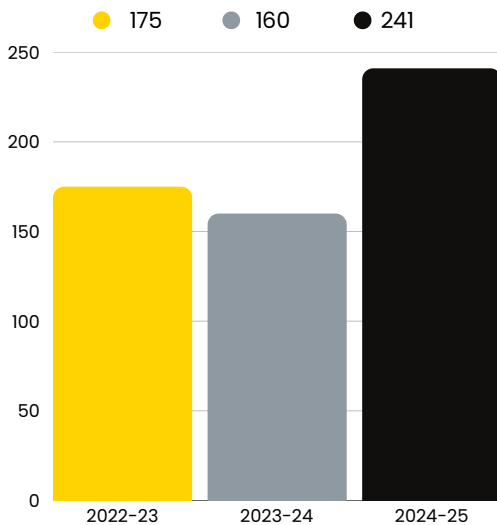
Optical Coherence Tomography (OCT)



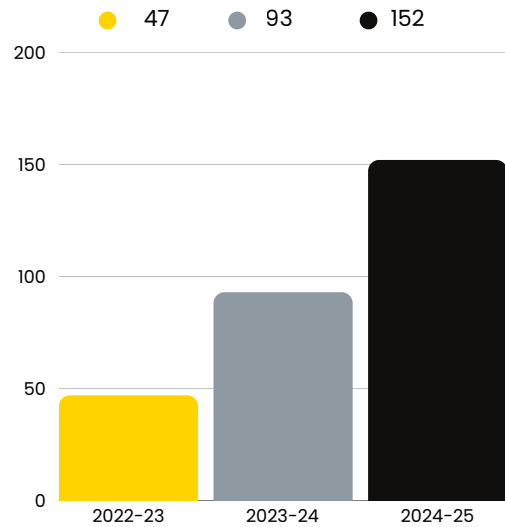
A-Scan

To meet the growing demand for surgical eye care, the Eye Unit at PEBS Hospital is equipped with cutting-edge technology and advanced infrastructure. The facility utilizes Green and YAG Lasers for precise procedures, Phacoemulsification machines for modern cataract surgeries, and high-resolution operating microscopes with comprehensive anesthesia support to ensure safety and accuracy. In addition to routine surgical interventions, the unit also undertakes specialized procedures such as corneal transplants, restoring sight to patients who would otherwise face irreversible vision loss.

These surgical capabilities not only address immediate patient needs but also align with PEBS Hospital's mission of reducing preventable blindness in the community. By combining innovation, surgical expertise, and compassionate care, the Eye Unit continues to transform lives, offering patients the opportunity to regain independence and improve their overall quality of life.

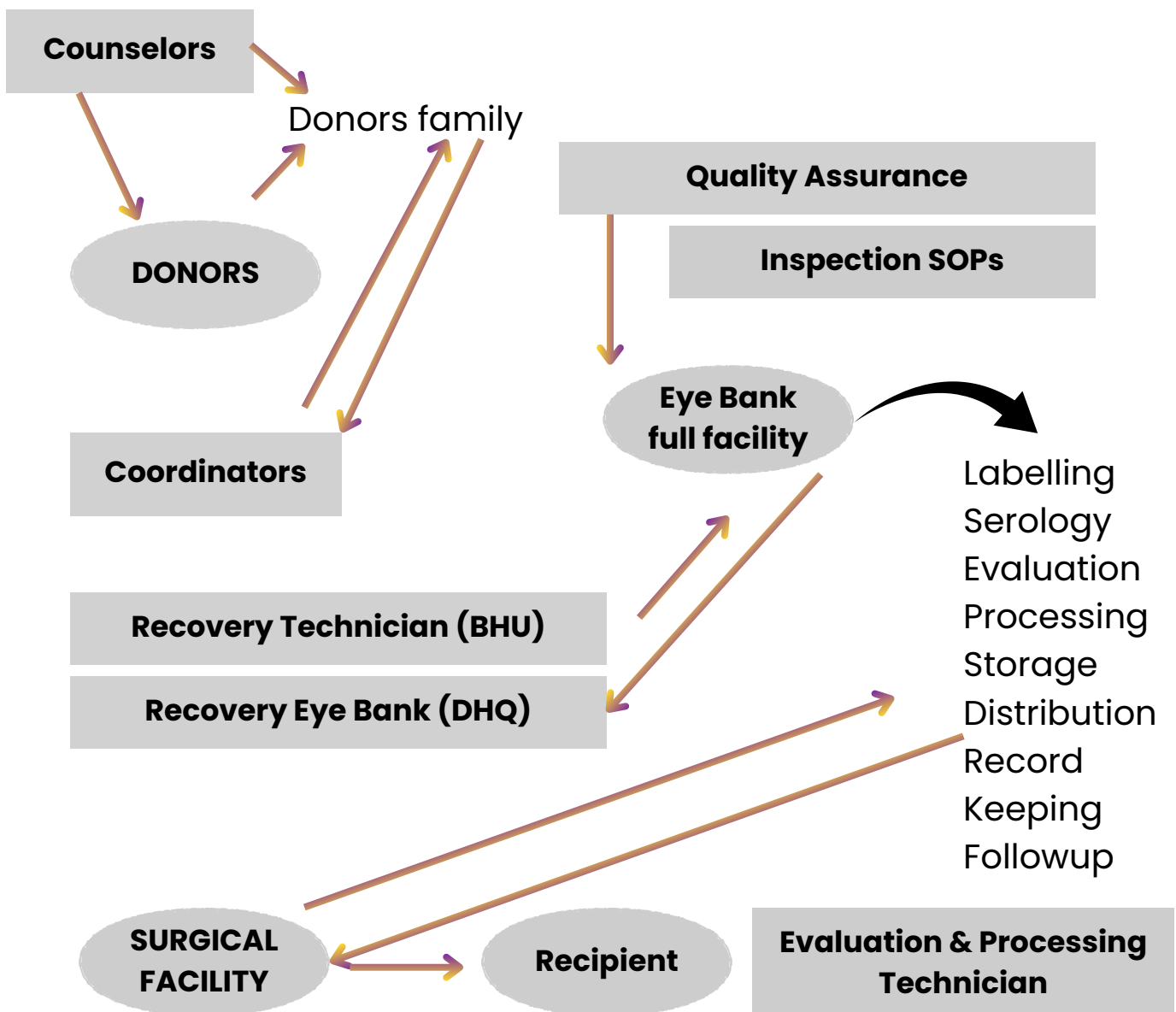

Eye Banking Project

This project aims to establish effective eye banking services and promote local cornea donation in Pakistan. It is a collaborative community focused model of Eye Bank, to develop a culture of voluntary cornea donation after death to help living blind.

The prime challenges are emotional, cultural and religious beliefs which have already been rectified by number of religious scholars and Islamic Ideology Council of Pakistan. State Law (Human Organ Transplants Act - HOTA) are in place to prevent any wrongdoings, trading for monetary gain or corrupt practices.

Where well-equipped Eye Bank established under the guidance of Eversight USA, with full facility functions.

Registry, Tissue Recovery, Serology, Tissue Evaluation, Tissue Processing, Tissue storage, Tissue Distribution, Quality Assurance, Tissue coding & Tracking, feedback & Adverse reaction reporting, Training of technicians & International Coordination Centre.

A dedicated team of PEBS, involving civil society, social workers and counselors work hard to create awareness using all available resources like social media, press, electronic media, seminars, lectures and meetings to promote voluntary cornea donation after death.

Eye bank team regularly give presentations at scientific sessions of national and international ophthalmic conferences. In collaboration with Consulate General of Sri Lanka in September 2023, an event was organized to celebrate 25000 donated eyes from Sri Lanka to Pakistan.

Over decades, PEBS hospital provided free corneal transplants surgical facilities to patients, through overseas donor corneas from Sri Lanka and USA courtesy Association of Pakistani Descent Physicians of North America - APPNA and valued financial donors.

PEBS Hospital stands as a pioneer in cornea donation in Pakistan, bringing the gift of sight to thousands of individuals. To date, the Eye Bank and Cornea Lab have facilitated more than 16,000 corneal transplants, all provided entirely free of cost. Strengthened by collaborations with international partners in Sri Lanka and the USA, the hospital continues to maintain a steady supply of donor corneas, enabling life transforming surgeries and reinforcing its commitment to accessible eye care.

The Eye Bank and Cornea Lab are equipped with advanced facilities for tissue recovery, evaluation, processing, and storage. All procedures are carried out following international standards, ensuring safety and effectiveness. By combining state of the art technology with a commitment to serving the underprivileged, PEBS Hospital continues to lead the way in corneal donation and transplantation, reaffirming its mission to combat blindness and improve lives across Pakistan.



Important to Know

- Eye donation means donation of Cornea only.
- Donor Cornea can be retrieved only after death within 8 hours.
- Cornea donation can be collected with permission of Next of Kin (NOK) or close relatives.
- Cornea donation is purely a voluntary act without any financial interest (Eyes cannot be bought or sold).
- Donor Cornea can be retrieved through minor surgical procedure at hospital, home or mortuary with respect and dignity to the body.
- Cornea donation after death is permissible in Islam (All religions endorse eye donation).
- Voluntary Cornea donation after death is a noble service to humanity.

DIALYSIS UNIT



2,703 DIALYSIS SESSIONS WERE DONE IN 2024-25

The Dialysis Unit at PEBS Hospital serves as a vital resource for patients living with kidney failure, providing life sustaining treatment in an area where no comparable facility exists. Established to address a critical healthcare gap, the unit ensures that access to dialysis is not determined by financial means.

Treatment is provided completely free of cost, reflecting PEBS Hospital's commitment to equity in healthcare and its mission to serve the most vulnerable. By combining modern equipment, skilled medical staff, and compassionate care, the unit not only saves lives but also restores dignity and hope to patients who would otherwise have limited options for survival.





Our facility is equipped with six state of the art dialysis machines, designed to deliver efficient and reliable care. Among these, two machines are dedicated exclusively to patients with Hepatitis B and C, housed in an isolated setting to prevent cross-contamination and uphold the highest standards of patient safety.

Beyond essential medical care, the unit extends comprehensive support by offering patients free meals and prescribed medicines during treatment sessions. This holistic model eases the financial and emotional burden on families, ensuring that patients can focus on their recovery without the stress of additional costs.

Every aspect of the Dialysis Unit from the advanced technology to the stringent hygiene protocols and compassionate care is a reflection of PEBS Hospital's unwavering commitment to accessible, safe, and dignified healthcare for all.



The Dialysis Unit at PEBS Hospital is designed to deliver advanced and reliable treatment for patients with kidney failure. Hemodialysis is the primary mode of treatment, where blood is filtered through specialized machines to remove toxins and excess fluids that the kidneys can no longer process. Our facility is equipped with state of the art hemodialysis machines that ensure both safety and efficiency in every session.

To maintain the highest standards of care, patients' vital signs including blood pressure, heart rate, and oxygen levels are continuously monitored by trained medical staff throughout the procedure. This vigilant supervision safeguards patient well being and provides reassurance during treatment.

Recognizing that treatment extends beyond the machine, the unit also places strong emphasis on patient education. Patients and their families are guided on kidney health, the dialysis process, and lifestyle adjustments that can improve quality of life and long term outcomes.

As part of our holistic care model, the unit provides nutritionally balanced, protein rich meals tailored to individual dietary needs. These meals help patients maintain strength, support metabolic balance, and meet essential nutritional requirements during dialysis.



STORY OF ENDURANCE

Imran Sheikh, a 45 year old carpenter, experienced a prolonged bout of flu and fever. In search of relief, he took a combination of medicines without realizing their potential side effects. Soon after, he began suffering from severe fatigue and swelling, symptoms that eventually revealed underlying kidney failure. His declining health left him unable to continue his work, threatening his family's livelihood.

A neighbor directed him to PEBS Hospital, where he was diagnosed with Chronic Kidney Disease. With no financial means for private care, Imran turned to PEBS free dialysis services. Today, with regular dialysis and a proper protein diet provided at no cost, he has regained his strength and stability.

ORAL CANCER SURGERY UNIT



Dental, Oral Cancer & Maxillofacial Surgery Team

The Dental, Oral Cancer, and Maxillofacial Surgery Department at PEBS provides essential diagnostic and treatment services focused on oral health, early cancer detection, and advanced maxillofacial care. Throughout the year, the team delivered routine dental treatments, conducted screenings for oral precancer and cancer, and managed complex surgical cases including trauma and corrective procedures.



With a commitment to clinical excellence and patient safety, the department continues to integrate preventive care, specialized expertise, and timely intervention. Its ongoing efforts contribute significantly to improving oral health outcomes and supporting PEBS's mission of accessible, high-quality healthcare for the community.



In March 2023, PEBS Hospital inaugurated Karachi's first entirely Free Oral Cancer Surgery Unit, that caters to the population of Sindh and Baluchistan. A groundbreaking step in expanding access to specialized cancer care.

Established through the generous contribution of Mr. Islam Salim, a devoted patron of PEBS Hospital, the unit reflects a strong commitment to saving lives and advancing healthcare equity.



Since its launch, the unit has successfully performed over 400 life saving oral cancer surgeries free of cost, offering critical treatment to patients who would otherwise be unable to afford it.

The unit offers following services

Surgical Facilities:

Surgery continues to be the primary and most effective treatment for oral cancer, particularly when the disease is detected at an early stage. At PEBS Hospital, our team of highly skilled surgeons specializes in both curative surgeries aimed at completely removing cancerous tumors and reconstructive surgeries, which restore appearance and functionality after tumor removal.

These procedures are performed in our state of the art operation theatre, equipped with advanced surgical technology to ensure safety, precision, and efficiency. The surgical approach is carefully planned to minimize damage to surrounding healthy tissues, helping patients retain facial aesthetics along with vital functions such as speech, chewing, and swallowing.

By combining surgical expertise with a strong focus on patient outcomes, PEBS Hospital ensures that every surgery not only addresses the disease but also supports the patient's physical, emotional, and social recovery.



Outpatient Department (OPD):

The unit's specialized OPD provides thorough consultations, including initial diagnosis, risk assessment, and treatment planning. Patients benefit from personalized evaluations conducted by experienced specialists, ensuring clarity and confidence in their care journey.



Post Surgical Care:

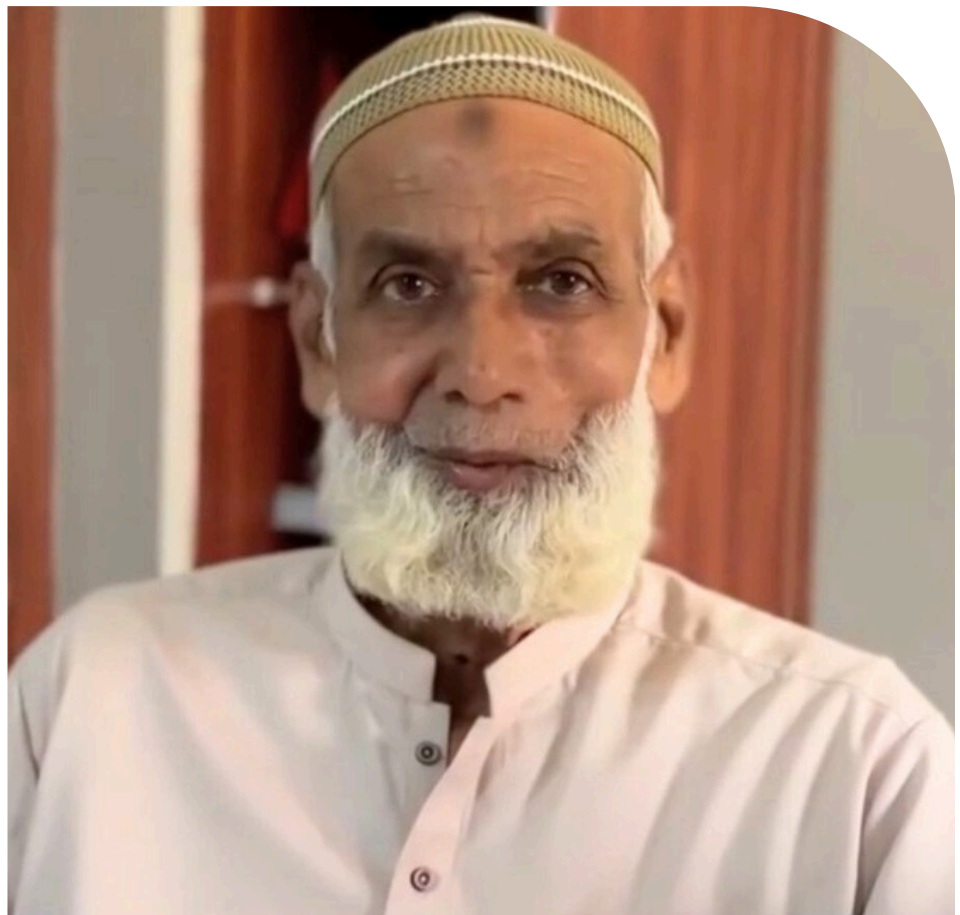

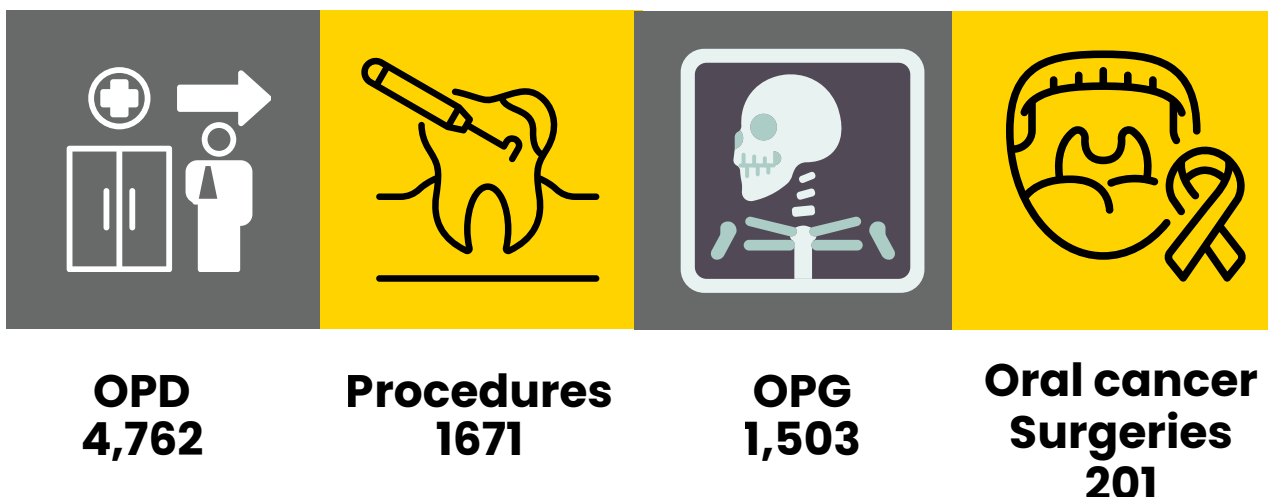

Established in March 2007, the OPD is Equipped with modern facilities and staffed by experienced professionals, the OPD offers a full spectrum of services from routine dental care to complex maxillofacial procedures under one roof. By combining cutting edge technology with compassionate care, we ensure that patients receive effective treatment in a safe and comfortable environment.

A defining feature of this OPD is its highly subsidized pricing structure, making quality dental and oral healthcare accessible to the local community. This approach not only addresses immediate clinical needs but also promotes long term oral health and overall well being for patients who might otherwise be unable to afford such services, and also completely free supported by zakat and donations.

DENTAL & MAXILLOFACIAL OPD

Facilities and Infrastructure

- Treatment Areas: The Out-Patient Department houses three fully equipped chairs, which including two dedicated to dental patients and one dedicated to maxillofacial examinations and procedures which includes every kind of minor to major oral surgeries, implants.
- Diagnostic and Safety Systems: On site X ray technology (OPG, cephalometry, periapical, all face views) supports accurate diagnosis, while advanced autoclave systems ensure the highest standards of sterilization and infection control, including sharps containments and disposal.
- Operational Reliability: A full load backup generator guarantees uninterrupted patient care, regardless of external conditions.

Cardiac & Diabetes Team

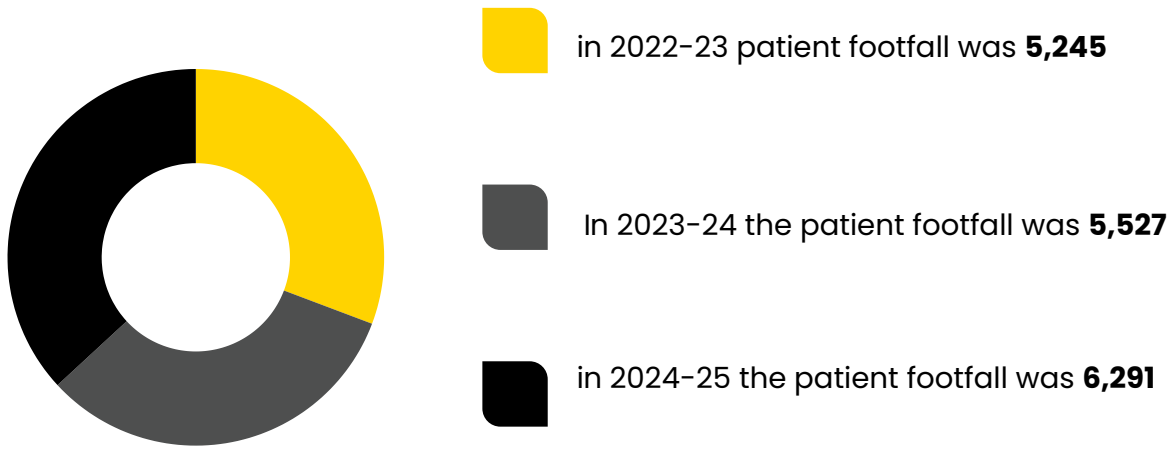

Cardiovascular disease (CVD) continues to be the world’s leading cause of death, yet nearly 90% of cases are preventable with timely medical care and lifestyle changes. Recognizing this urgent need, PEBS Hospital launched its dedicated Cardiovascular Unit to deliver accessible, specialized services for the diagnosis, management, and prevention of heart related conditions.

The unit combines advanced diagnostic facilities with expert medical care, offering patients comprehensive treatment pathways. Alongside clinical services, it actively promotes awareness of preventive measures such as healthy nutrition, exercise, and the management of risk factors including blood pressure, cholesterol, and diabetes.

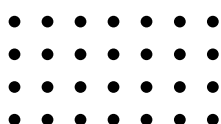


BREAST CANCER SURGERY UNIT





In 2024, the Cowasjee Foundation donated a Mammogram and Ultrasound machine to PEBS Hospital, enhancing the hospital's capacity for early breast cancer detection. Later, in June 2025, the Breast Cancer Surgery Unit was donated and inaugurated by Ms. Ava Cowasjee, marking a significant addition to PEBS Hospital's efforts in providing accessible and quality breast cancer care.



BREAST CANCER SURGERY UNIT



Breast cancer remains the most commonly diagnosed cancer among women in Pakistan and a leading cause of cancer related deaths, largely due to late stage diagnoses resulting from low awareness and limited access to diagnostic facilities. Recognizing this critical gap, PEBS Hospital established a specialized Breast Cancer Unit dedicated exclusively to early detection.

By offering free outpatient consultations, mammography, and ultrasound services, the unit ensures that financial hardship does not prevent women from receiving timely and potentially life saving screenings.

Through this initiative, PEBS Hospital reinforces its commitment to reducing the burden of breast cancer and safeguarding the well being of women in the communities it serves.

Ultrasound Facilities

Complementing mammography, ultrasounds deliver detailed diagnostic insights, ensuring accuracy and reliability in identifying early signs of disease.



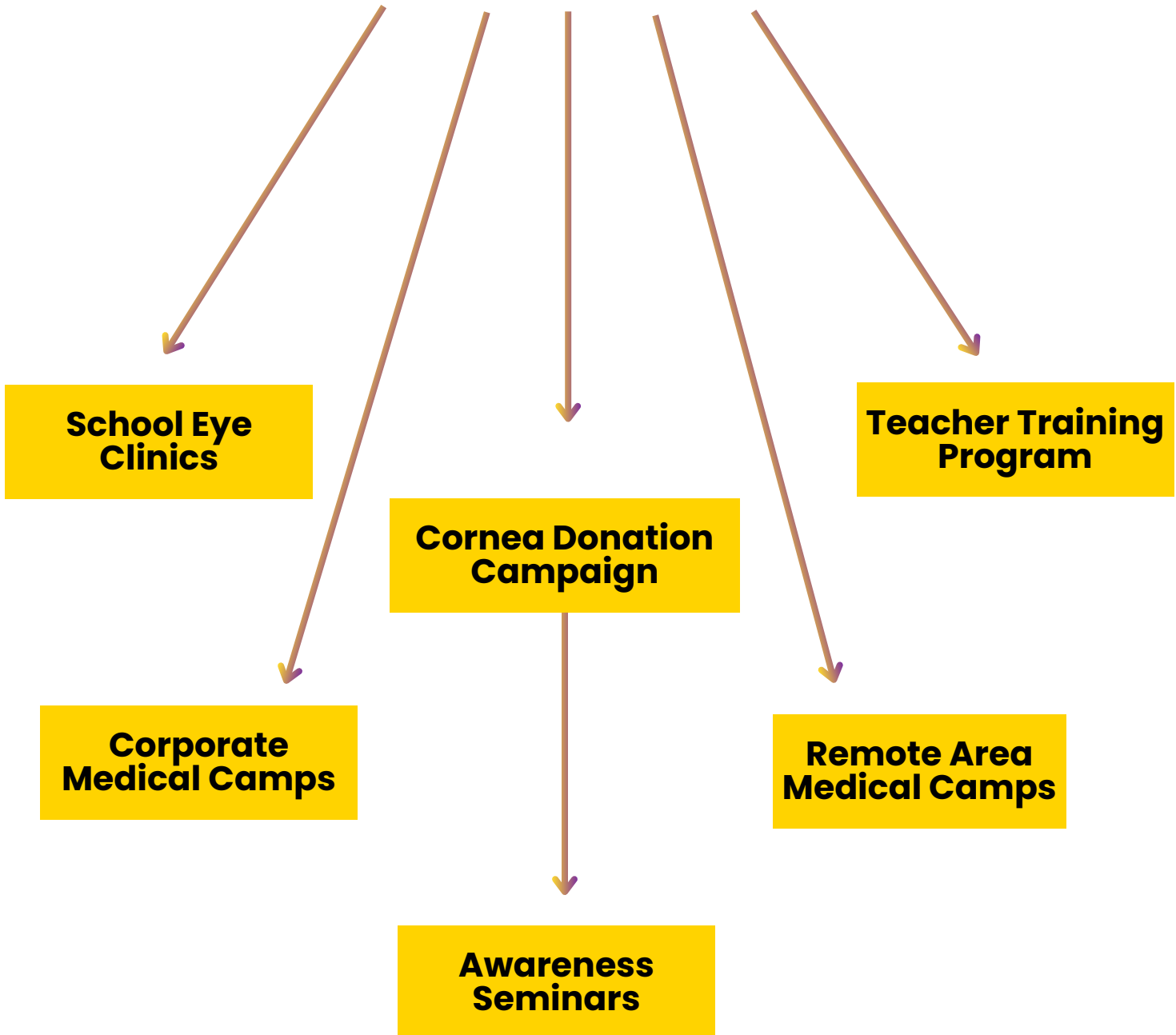
AWARENESS AND EDUCATION

School Eye Clinic



Since 2017

The School Eye Clinic Program was initiated by Pakistan Eye Bank Society with the objective of screening schoolchildren for vision problems at an early stage and creating awareness that many eye diseases are preventable.

Due to financial limitations, the program faced challenges in continuation until the family of former PEBS President, Mr. Iftikhar Hussain, extended their support. In recognition of their contribution, the program was renamed as "The Akbari Begum School Eye Clinic Program". To date, the initiative has screened over 65,000 schoolchildren across Karachi.

Our esteemed Patron, Mr. Islam Salim generously donated a transport van to speed-up transportation of school eye clinic project.

In May 2025, the program received official sponsorship from the Rotary Club of Heidelberg Schloss, with a target to screen 60,000 students within one year. Within just six months, PEBS has successfully achieved the target and screened over 30,000 students, continuing its mission to prevent avoidable blindness.

School Eye Clinic Team

The School Eye Clinic (SEC) program at PEBS Hospital is led by a specialized team of ophthalmologists, optometrists, ophthalmic technicians, and trained support staff who are dedicated to advancing children's eye health. The team's work focuses on early detection, timely intervention, and awareness building, ensuring that vision related barriers do not hinder a child's educational journey.

Through structured school visits, the team conducts comprehensive screenings, refractions, and vision assessments. Where required, corrective measures such as prescription glasses are provided on site, while students diagnosed with more complex eye conditions are referred to PEBS Hospital for specialized care.

In addition to direct clinical services, the SEC team plays a pivotal role in capacity building. By training teachers to identify early signs of vision impairment, the program extends its reach beyond scheduled clinics, embedding sustainable awareness within the school environment.

The professionalism, expertise, and commitment of the SEC team have positioned this initiative as an integral part of PEBS Hospital's preventive healthcare strategy, ensuring that thousands of students receive the support they need to achieve their full academic and personal potential.

A New Vision for Learning

“My name is Mariya, and I am in class five. For many months, I could not see the blackboard clearly. I felt shy to ask the teacher again and again, and sometimes I copied the wrong things in my notebook. I thought maybe I was not smart enough.

When the PEBS team came to my school and checked my eyes, they gave me glasses. The first time I wore them, I could read the blackboard clearly. Now I can study properly, write without mistakes, and answer questions in class with confidence. I feel so happy because learning is easy for me again.”

Mariya, a 14 years old student, struggled every day in class because she could not see the blackboard clearly. Her grades began to slip, and she often felt left behind compared to her classmates.

When PEBS Hospital conducted a School Eye Clinic at her school, Mariya’s eyesight was thoroughly examined. She was diagnosed with a refractive error and was provided with a pair of corrective glasses on the spot.

The change was immediate. For the first time, Mariya could read the blackboard without difficulty, participate confidently in class, and complete her assignments with ease. Her teachers noticed the difference in her performance, and Mariya regained her enthusiasm for learning.





On May 7, 2025, Pakistan Eye Bank Society (PEBS) entered into a strategic partnership with the Rotary Club of Heidelberg-Schloss, Germany, through the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding in Heidelberg. The MoU was signed by Mr. Qazi Sajid Ali, President of PEBS, and Dr. Tilman Krauch on behalf of the Rotary Club.

Through this collaboration, PEBS will conduct School Eye Clinics in Karachi to screen children for vision impairments and provide timely treatment. This initiative reinforces PEBS's commitment to eradicating preventable blindness by ensuring early detection and management of conditions such as refractive errors, amblyopia, and other causes of vision loss among schoolchildren.



Following the signing of the Memorandum of Understanding, Pakistan Eye Bank Society officially launched its School Eye Clinic Project in collaboration with the

Rotary Club of Heidelberg-Schloss on May 27, 2025, in Karachi, Pakistan. The inauguration was graced by H.E. Dr. Ruediger Lotz, Consul General of Germany, who formally commenced the project.

The ceremony was attended by esteemed patrons, supporters, and the dedicated PEBS team. Dr. Tilman Krauch and Mr. Tobias Dratt from the Rotary Club of Heidelberg-Schloss joined virtually to extend their support and share their insights on the significance of the initiative. During the event, mementos were presented to PEBS supporters in recognition of their valuable contributions toward advancing community healthcare.

Through this partnership, PEBS has set a target to screen 60,000 schoolchildren within one year, aiming for the early detection and treatment of vision related conditions

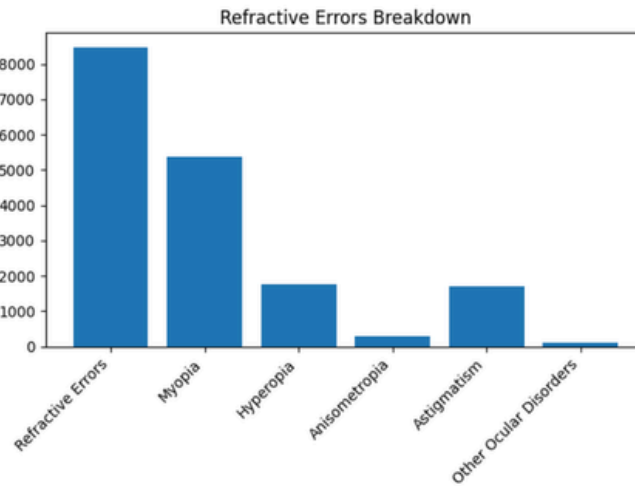

Why School Eye Screening is Important?

Early Detection:

Early detection of vision problems can prevent long-term damage and academic delays.

Conditions like nearsightedness, farsightedness, and color blindness can be caught early.



Preventing Learning Delays:

Uncorrected vision problems often result in reading difficulties, lack of focus, academic challenges and school drop-outs



Reducing Eye Health Risks:

Identifying more serious conditions like vitamin A deficiency, strabismus (crossed eyes) or amblyopia (lazy eye).

The team is composed of experienced ophthalmologists, physicians, surgeons, anesthetists, paramedical staff, and community outreach workers who work in close coordination to deliver comprehensive medical and surgical services.

Beyond clinical expertise, the team brings compassion and empathy to their work, often traveling long distances and working extended hours to serve individuals who would otherwise have no access to healthcare. Their efforts not only restore vision and improve health but also instill hope in communities that have long faced neglect and barriers to medical care.

Prior to each camp, the team engages in meticulous preparation, ensuring the availability of medicines, surgical instruments, diagnostic tools, and essential supplies. This rigorous planning allows for the seamless execution of large scale operations, including free cataract surgeries, general medical consultations, cardiac and diabetes check-ups, diagnostic tests, and the distribution of prescribed medicines.

The Remote Area Camp Team stands as a reflection of PEBS Hospital's mission—bridging healthcare gaps with dedication, professionalism, and a deep sense of social responsibility.

Gift of Vision

Launched as a flagship initiative, the Gift of Vision Project set out with the mission of restoring sight to underserved communities through free cataract surgeries. In its second year, the project achieved a remarkable milestone by facilitating over 5,620 successful cataract surgeries, bringing light back into the lives of thousands of individuals and enabling them to lead healthier, more independent lives.

In its initial phase, the project focused primarily on cataract surgeries; however, growing demand in remote communities highlighted the urgent need for a more holistic healthcare approach. Responding to this, the initiative has evolved into the Gift of Life, a comprehensive program providing not only free eye surgeries but also:

- General medical consultations
- Specialized care in breast cancer and gynecology
- Comprehensive cardiac and diabetes services
- Eye health consultations
- Free medicines and laboratory tests
- Food aid and nutritional support
- Wheelchairs, slippers, and other essential supplies



A major milestone has been the introduction of a mobile healthcare unit, equipped to function both as a hygienic consultation facility and a temporary operating theatre. Beyond on-site services, this unit now also transports patients from remote areas to PEBS Hospital, ensuring they receive advanced treatments and follow-up care that were previously inaccessible.

Through this transformation, PEBS Hospital has moved beyond restoring sight to delivering comprehensive healthcare support for marginalized communities, reaffirming its commitment to improving lives and preventing avoidable suffering.

Los Angeles Fundraiser

This year marked a significant milestone as PEBS USA successfully hosted its second fundraiser in Los Angeles, once again reaffirming the commitment of our international partners toward advancing healthcare in Pakistan. The event was attended by distinguished guests and led with great dedication by Dr. Kashif Farooqui, Head of the Eye Unit at PEBS Hospital, who traveled to Los Angeles to represent the hospital and present its life changing initiatives.

Dr. Farooqui shared the remarkable progress of PEBS Hospital's flagship programs, including the Gift of Vision Project, which has restored sight to thousands through free cataract surgeries in rural communities, as well as the expansion of corneal transplants, eye bank services, and other essential healthcare initiatives. His presentation highlighted not only the achievements of the past year but also the pressing need for sustained support to extend these services to even more underserved populations.

A central feature of this year's fundraiser was the invaluable partnership with the Women's Team Los Angeles. Over the years, this relationship has grown into a powerful force that is directly saving and transforming lives in Pakistan. Their unwavering generosity and continued trust in PEBS have enabled us to bring hope and healing to countless families who otherwise lack access to quality healthcare.

The evening proved to be a resounding success, strengthening ties with the global community and securing vital contributions that will fuel PEBS Hospital's mission in the coming year. With the continued support of our partners, donors, and well-wishers worldwide, PEBS remains steadfast in its vision of delivering free, high-quality healthcare and creating lasting impact in the lives of those most in need.





Free Cataract Surgeries in Remote Areas

Cataract remains one of the leading causes of preventable blindness in Pakistan, particularly in underserved and remote regions where access to quality healthcare is severely limited. Recognizing this urgent need, PEBS Hospital has continued its Gift of Vision Project, an initiative dedicated to restoring sight and improving quality of life through free of cost cataract surgeries.

To date, PEBS has successfully performed 10,820 cataract surgeries, bringing light and hope to thousands of individuals who were otherwise at risk of permanent blindness. These procedures are conducted by skilled ophthalmologists and medical teams who travel to remote villages and underprivileged areas, ensuring that people who cannot reach urban centres are not deprived of essential eye care.

Our commitment extends well beyond the surgery itself. PEBS Hospital provides free medicines and follow up care to every patient. For those requiring further treatment at the hospital, we arrange free transportation and food aid, so that financial constraints never become a barrier to recovery. This holistic support system ensures that patients not only regain their vision but also receive the dignity and care they deserve throughout the healing process.

Free Medicines Distribution

As part of Project Gift of Vision, PEBS ensured access to essential healthcare by distributing free medicines to underserved communities

46,342 Patients benefited

Free Consultation Services

Alongside eye care, the project established multi-specialty OPDs in remote areas, including General, Gynecology, Breast Cancer, Cardiac, and Diabetes clinics. These free services provided patients with comprehensive medical support, addressing diverse health needs in a single accessible platform.

54,756 Patients benefited



Free Lab Tests

PEBS provided free laboratory testing facilities at its medical and surgical camps. Free diagnostic services, including CBC, blood pressure, blood sugar, Hepatitis B & C, and malaria screening.

12,750 Patients benefited

Food Aid

This initiative was introduced after early camps revealed alarming cases of malnutrition, with many patients presenting severely low hemoglobin levels. By integrating food support into the program, PEBS ensures that beneficiaries not only receive life changing surgeries and medical care but also the essential nutrition needed for recovery and improved overall health.

47,000 Patients benefited



Slipper Distribution Initiative

During last year's Project Gift of Vision camps in Morai Village and Bahawalnagar, many children were found without slippers, lacked proper clothing, and suffered from low hemoglobin due to malnutrition. In response, PEBS extended its support by providing food aid and slippers to address these pressing needs.

Wheel chair Initiative

During a Project Gift of Vision camp, the PEBS team met a woman using a broken wheelchair that left her injured and in pain. This incident deeply touched one of our donors, inspiring the launch of wheelchair distribution to support individuals with mobility challenges.



Awareness Sessions

PEBS Hospital places strong emphasis on health education as a vital component of preventive care. Through structured awareness sessions and seminars, we actively work to inform and empower communities about pressing health concerns. These programs focus particularly on eye health, corneal donation, oral cancer, and breast cancer, reflecting the hospital's commitment to addressing conditions that carry profound social and medical impact in Pakistan.

Our initiatives are thoughtfully designed to reach diverse groups, including teachers, office professionals, university students, and the general public. Each session provides practical knowledge, encourages early health seeking behavior, and highlights the importance of timely diagnosis. By engaging audiences in an interactive and accessible manner, these programs not only increase awareness but also foster a culture of responsibility and proactive health management.





Corneal Donation Awareness

Corneal blindness remains one of the leading causes of visual impairment in Pakistan, and yet it is among the most preventable. Through our awareness sessions, participants are educated on the life-changing potential of corneal transplants, which can restore sight and transform futures. The sessions also address deep rooted cultural beliefs and social misconceptions that often act as barriers to donation. By fostering open dialogue and providing factual information, these initiatives encourage individuals to consider corneal donation as an act of compassion and legacy, thereby increasing the potential donor pool and offering hope to thousands awaiting sight restoring procedures.



Oral Cancer Awareness

Oral cancer is a growing health concern in Pakistan, particularly due to widespread tobacco use, betel nut chewing, and unhealthy lifestyle practices. Our awareness sessions focus on educating participants about key risk factors, while also emphasizing the importance of lifestyle modifications such as quitting tobacco and maintaining good oral hygiene. Beyond prevention, participants are taught how to recognize early warning signs, such as persistent mouth sores or unusual growths, and the critical role of early detection in saving lives. By encouraging regular screenings and proactive health behavior, these sessions aim to reduce the prevalence of late-stage oral cancer diagnoses.



Breast Cancer Awareness

Breast cancer is the most common cancer among women in Pakistan, and the high mortality rate is largely due to delayed diagnosis. PEBS Hospital's awareness programs aim to empower women with knowledge and confidence to take control of their health. Participants are guided on performing regular self-examinations, recognizing early symptoms, and understanding when to seek medical advice. These sessions also emphasize the role of mammography and ultrasound in detecting abnormalities at an early, treatable stage. By breaking the silence around breast health and addressing the social stigma often associated with cancer, these programs encourage women to prioritize early detection, ultimately saving lives.

Corporate Medical Camps



At PEBS Hospital, we recognize that healthy vision is not only vital for individual well-being but also directly linked to workplace productivity and efficiency. To address this need, we have developed Corporate Medical Eye Camps, a program designed to deliver high-quality eye care directly within organizational settings.

In partnership with leading corporations and institutions, our dedicated medical teams establish fully equipped onsite clinics that bring eye care to the doorstep of employees. These camps include comprehensive vision assessments, refraction tests, and expert consultations with qualified ophthalmologists, ensuring that every individual receives timely evaluation and guidance. Where corrective measures are needed, prescription glasses are provided on the spot, helping employees return to their professional and personal routines without delay. For individuals identified with more complex eye conditions, direct referrals to PEBS Hospital ensure continuity of care and access to specialized treatment.

This initiative has created a meaningful impact by embedding preventive healthcare into the corporate environment. By prioritizing the eye health of their workforce, companies not only safeguard employee well-being but also nurture a healthier, more focused, and more productive workplace.

As this program continues to expand, PEBS Hospital remains committed to strengthening partnerships with the corporate sector—ensuring that professionals across industries can benefit from quality eye care without the barriers of distance, time, or accessibility.

PEBS Satellite Centre, Gadap Town

Bringing Accessible Healthcare to Underserved Communities



Under the umbrella of Project Gift of Vision, PEBS Hospital took a significant step forward by establishing a Satellite Centre in Gadap Town, a region long deprived of timely medical care. For years, residents of Gadap faced not only prolonged delays in treatment but also a widespread lack of awareness about the seriousness of their health conditions. This combination often led to worsening illnesses that could have been prevented with earlier intervention.

The establishment of the PEBS Gadap Satellite Centre directly responds to these challenges. The facility provides the local population with access to timely medical consultations, early detection of health issues, and awareness programs that emphasize the importance of seeking care without delay. By situating healthcare closer to those who need it most, PEBS Hospital has made critical services more accessible, reducing the burden of travel and wait times for the community.

This initiative represents more than just an extension of PEBS Hospital's reach—it reflects a commitment to equity in healthcare. By creating a reliable point of care within Gadap Town, the Satellite Centre is helping individuals take charge of their health, ensuring that no one suffers simply because of limited access or delayed diagnosis.

PIB Colony Healthcare Centre

The PIB Colony Healthcare Centre represents a meaningful milestone in the journey of PEBS Hospital to extend accessible medical services to local communities. Established on a 300-yard plot generously donated in 2016 by Mrs. Qamar-un-Nisa Begum a devoted social worker and retired Director of Special Education the center stands as a testament to her vision of providing healthcare to those in need. Her philanthropic contribution laid the foundation for a facility that began operations in September 2018 and continues to serve as a vital hub of care for the surrounding community.

The centre is equipped to provide a range of essential services, including a fully functional Eye OPD supported by a dedicated operating theater for cataract surgeries, ensuring timely and effective treatment for patients at risk of vision loss. In addition, the Cardiac OPD addresses pressing cardiovascular concerns through accessible consultations, while the Dental OPD, complete with its own operation theater, caters to preventive and procedural dental care.

Through these services, the PIB Colony Healthcare Centre brings together medical expertise and community centered compassion. It not only reduces the burden on underprivileged families by making specialized care locally available, but also reflects PEBS Hospital's enduring commitment to bridging healthcare gaps where they are needed most.

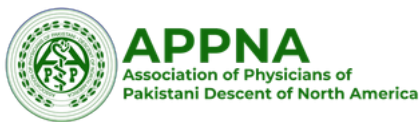

VISIT TO PAKISTAN OF

Mrs. Sirimavo Bandaranaike

PRIME MINISTER OF SRI LANKA

Mrs. Bandaranaike, paid a visit to Pakistan in September, 1974. The indication of the intended visit was received from the Eye Donation Society of Sri Lanka well in advance to enable the Karachi Lions Eye Bank to arrange a function in honour of the visiting Prime Minister of Sri Lanka, to express the thanks of the Eye Bank, the patients who received the corneal graft from Sri Lanka eyes, and the people of Pakistan generally. Government of Pakistan was requested to include in the itinerary of the visiting Prime Minister a Reception by the Karachi Lions Eye Bank for this purpose. As Mrs. Bandaranaike was to stay in Karachi only for a day, the Government of Pakistan expressed regrets that inclusion of a Reception by the Karachi Eye Bank was not possible. The Government however, suggested that a selected and representative number of patients and some of Eye Bank officials would be allowed to stand in the Reception Line at the Airport when Mrs. Bandaranaike arrives at the Karachi Airport and also when she leaves Karachi accordingly, 10 patients and five officials of the

The Prime Minister of Sri Lanka, Ms. Sirimavo Bandaranaike paid a state visit to Pakistan in September 1974.

She warmly shook hands with each person and expressed her heartfelt pleasure to see that so many persons were able to see the world through the humane gift of vision by the eye donors of Sri Lanka. The recipients thanked the Prime Minister and her Sri Lankan brethren for their compassionate gesture.

This emotional welcome remains a historic symbol of friendship and humanitarian bonding between Pakistan and Sri Lanka.

BEGUM RAANA LIAQUATALI KHAN

Governor of Sind

"Daughter of an ancient and proud civilization, she took upon herself the noble duty of guiding the women of her country into the wide areas of modern social, cultural and civic life. A work, which in other nations took centuries of time and absorbed the energies of many generations, she accomplished in the span of little more than a decade".

The above is part of the citation of the International Gimbel Award Begum Raana Liaquat Ali Khan received in 1962. She received this award as one of the outstanding women of the world and she was the first recipient of the award.

Her interest in the activities of the Eye Bank Movement in the country is natural because service to mankind is in her blood. When the Eye Bank Bulletin was started two years ago, she honoured us with a very encouraging message which was published in the first issue of the Eye Bank Bulletin in September, 1972. She very kindly inaugurated in July 1974 the Library/Reading Room and Eye Donation Motivation Centre at Landhi sponsored by the Karachi Lions Eye Bank. On the occasion she was approached by the Eye Bank Workers to sign the Eye Donation Will Card, which she did without any hesitation.

It is a milestone in the progress of the Eye Bank Movement in Pakistan that the most outstanding woman of the country has actively associated herself with the Movement by signing the Eye Donation Will Card. We are proud of this association which assures the ultimate success of the Eye Bank Movement in Pakistan.
